Stay Safe Speak Out

Thank you to Chris and Margaret from the NSPCC 'Stay Safe and Speak Out' team for their informative and engaging workshop which they delivered to our Y5 and Y6 children last week. Speak out Stay safe is a safeguarding programme for children aged 5- to 11-years-old.

The programme helps children understand:

- abuse in all its forms and how to recognise signs of abuse
- that abuse is never a child's fault and that they have the right to be safe
- where to get help and the sources of help available to them, including our <u>Childline</u> service.

All children from Y1- Y6 have had the opportunity to watch the Ant and Dec Speak out Stay safe assembly.



National Online Safety Accreditation
